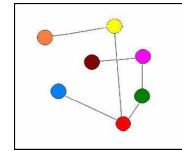

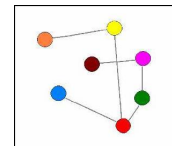
1. How does the project contribute to material security? How does the project reduce poverty?
2. How does the project enhance living standards and quality of life?
3. How does the project foster commitment in voluntary work and club affiliation (social capital, civil involvement)?
4. How does the project foster cooperation – the networking of different stakeholders in a community? (different generations, genders, marginalised groups)?
5. How does the project foster education and further education?
6. How does the project foster health and health precautions?
7. How does the project foster diversity, tolerance and solidarity in a community?
8. How does the project contribute to stronger identification with the living environment?
9. How does the project foster one's own initiative and contributes to neighbourly help?
10. How does the project foster a valuable association with each other (also concerning political culture)?
